The Occurrence of *Ibalia takachihoi* Yasumatsu (Hymenoptera, Ibalidae) in Honshu, Japan

Ibalia takachihoi Yasumatsu is known as an important parasitoid of a siricid, Tremex longicollis Konow (Yasumatsu, 1943). Until now, this parasitoid has been recorded in Kyushu, Japan. Recently, I had an opportunity to examine a female specimen of I. takachihoi, collected by Dr. T. Kimura, at Kitashirakawa-nishimati, Kyoto, on May 22, 1939. This is the first record of the occurrence of this wasp in Honshu.
