The English Literary Society of Japan, founded in 1917, is an association of scholars in the fields of English and American literature and the English language. Its members are entitled to attend the Society's annual meeting to read papers or participate in other activities of the Society. They can also submit their unsolicited articles for publication in the Society's journal, Studies in English Literature. It is published thrice yearly, and of those three issues published one is a special number consisting of articles written in English, the other two mostly in Japanese.

The journal is distributed free to members of the Society, whose annual membership dues are ¥7,000. Overseas applicants for membership should pay ¥7,700, a sum including bank charges for the collection of the proceeds of foreign cheques. The fee should be paid in yen; any other currency is not acceptable.

Members must conform to the following rules in submitting manuscripts intended for publication.

- Articles are restricted to unpublished work, but papers that have been delivered at meetings are eligible when that fact is noted.
- All footnotes must be grouped together at the end of the work. The MLA Style Sheet, Style Manual, or Handbook 3rd Ed. should be used as a guide for most style points.
- The length of articles should be not more than 25 pages (25 lines of 65 letters, including the endnotes).
- Articles should be sent with 3 copies (4 in all) to the Editors at the

- (5) One brief curriculum vitae and 4 copies of a précis of not more than 2 pages should be sent with the manuscript.
- (6) Each contributor will receive 20 free offprints.
- (7) Those who want their manuscript back should enclose a stamped, self-addressed envelope or international coupons to cover postage.
- (8) As for proof-reading, the contributor is allowed only first-proof correction, in which he must strictly limit his proof-reading to typological errors, without changing or adding to what he has written.
