## The 20th Mutual Visit Program between the National Diet Library and the National Library of Korea

Mr. Cho introduced major activities of 2017 to enhance the functions and roles of the NLK and the current prioritized works. In Sessions 1 and 2, experts from both libraries reported on their recent activities and achievements. At the National Library for Children and Young Adults of the NLK, both representatives reported on their library's services for children. The reports and discussions were highly thought-provoking for both sides.



After these sessions, the delegation visited the National Digital Library of Korea, Seoul National University Library, the National Museum of Korea, and other related institutions.
