The lecture meeting opened with remarks by Mr. Noritada Otaki, Librarian of the NDL, and then proceeded according to the program below.

After a quick introduction of the BL, Mr. Keating provided an overview of the vision "Living Knowledge: The British Library 2015-2023" which was set out in anticipation of its 50th anniversary in 2023, based on the six purposes: Custodianship; Research; Business; Culture; Learning and International, and he explained how to enhance its contribution to the community. Mr. Keating said "Living Knowledge" describes a Library that will have transformed itself in response to profound changes in technology, research and information services. It is an ambitious prospectus for growth and continued development, aiming to be the most open, creative and innovative institution of its kind in the world.

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After the lecture, a Question and Answer Session was conducted with the interviewer Prof. Emer. Shunsaku Tamura (Keio University). Mr. Keating answered a wide range of questions from the floor, including how to collaborate with other deposit libraries in the UK, cooperation with universities to collect and provide research data, business support services in collaboration with public libraries, how to make use of its intellectual resource in school education, international cooperation with initiatives such as <u>Europeana</u>, and the BL's contribution to the London Olympic games.

Some participants answered the questionnaires after the event, saying that the British Library's new vision was very attractive and it would be informative also for libraries in Japan, and that the interview-style Question and Answer session encouraged deep discussion.

Next year will be the final year of the NDL's <u>Mission and Objectives 2012-2016</u>. This experience will be a great help to set up a new vision of the NDL.
