Training for Japanese Studies Librarians Outside of Japan: Library services practicum at the Kansai-kan of the NDL 2016



From January 13 to 22, 2016, the National Diet Library (NDL) hosted a training program for Japanese Studies librarians living outside Japan. It was held at the Kansaikan of the NDL in Kyoto, and 12 participants joined from five countries: France, Germany, Italy, the Republic of Korea, and the United States.

The program included lectures by NDL staff on topics including how to use the NDL's databases and how to search for information on Japan, and a special lecture about Japanese culture and digital archives by Dr. Aki Ishigami, who was invited as a specialist. Participants also engaged in tasks such as document research at the General Collection Room of the Kansai-kan. Exchange meetings were held for participants and NDL staff to share views and information.

Visiting related institutions was also part of the training program. Participants learned about facilities and collections, as well as engaging in individual research. Participants also exchanged views and information with staff members of the institutions.

A briefing session was held on the last day. Each participant commented on NDL services, taking into account the achievements made during the program. The contents of the program were as follows.

At the exchange meetings held on January 14 and 15, participants made their requests such as: making available the Digitized Contents Transmission Service for Libraries in Japan to overseas institutions, enhancing the convenience of ILL services and document supply services, etc.

Presentations made at the briefing session on January 22 included opinions from participants that the overseas Japanese studies are in decline, and there is a necessity for the NDL to actively deliver more information related to Japan. There were also requests on enhancing accessibility to the NDL's digitized materials from abroad.

91% of the participants were satisfied with the training program. Many participants commented that they hope for the program to be continued and improved, including remote training programs via the Internet and training

programs by dispatched NDL staff to meetings of Japanese studies librarians.
